

“Word – transcription” Dominoes

NB: keep all domino sets in separate envelopes. Do not mix them up, for it will be impossible to play.

You need a set of word-transcription dominoes.

Number of players: 2 or 3 if the number of cards permits.

Rules of the game:

1. As there is a different number of cards in each domino set, before the game count how many cards each player will have.

2. Shuffle the cards with their face down and divide them equally between the players.

3. Player 1, choose a tile and put it down on the table. Read out loud the word and the transcription.

4. Player 2, look at your cards to see if you have a matching word or transcription. If you have it, place it at the right end. If you don't have any, Player 1, or Player 3, if there are three players, makes a move.

5. The winner is the player who is the first to have no cards left.

Домино «Слово – транскрипция»

Обратите внимание: храните все наборы домино в отдельных конвертах. Не путайте их, потому что играть будет невозможно.

Вам нужен набор карточек домино «Слово – транскрипция».

Количество игроков: 2 или 3, если позволяет количество карточек.

Правила игры:

1. Поскольку в каждом наборе домино разное количество карточек, перед игрой подсчитайте, сколько карточек домино будет у каждого игрока.

2. Перемешайте карточки домино лицевой стороной вниз и поделите их поровну между игроками.

3. Игрок 1, выберите карточку домино и положите её на стол. Прочитайте вслух слово и транскрипцию.

4. Игрок 2, посмотрите на свои карточки, чтобы узнать, есть ли у вас подходящее слово или транскрипция. Если есть, то поместите слово или транскрипцию с соответствующей стороны. Если у вас нет подходящего слова или транскрипции, Игрок 1, или Игрок 3, при наличии трёх игроков, делает ход.

5. Победителем становится игрок, у которого не осталось карточек.
