**The 'Obby' Oss (= hobby horse) festival**  
*one of the most famous folk customs in the UK*

<b>place</b>	Padstow in North Cornwall
<b>time</b>	May Day
<b>roots</b>	origin / unknown; possibly connected with an ancient Celtic festival; 1803 – first described in print; since 1913 – a tourist attraction
<b>activities involved</b>	the town / decorate with greenery, flowers, and flags; 4 parades by two teams in turn through the streets of the town; dance and sing; hobby horses / try to catch girls and women
<b>participants</b>	2 men / dress as hobby horses (a red and a blue one) / wear scary masks; a team: people in white with red or blue ribbons and scarves / follow the hobby horse, (red and blue); horse, dance, sing

#### Student B

**Abbot Bromley Horn Dance**  
*one of the oldest traditions in Europe*

<b>place</b>	Abbots Bromley (a village) in Staffordshire
<b>time</b>	the Monday following the first Sunday after 4 September
<b>roots</b>	origin / unclear; date back to the Middle Ages; the horns (pora / pori) used in the dance – 11 <sup>th</sup> century; commemorate hunting rights given to the villagers
<b>activities involved</b>	8 a.m. – dance on the village green; till 8 p.m. – visit several nearby villages and dance there
<b>participants</b>	12 dancers (men): 6 Deermen dressed in Tudor style costumes and carrying horns, a hobby horse, Maid Marian (a man dressed as a woman), a fool (шут / блазан), 2 boys and a man playing the accordion

## LESSON 7

### Ex. 5. a.

#### Situation 1

**Student A** is a young man who plays a knight at the festival. You have just won the knights' tournament. You are taking off your armour (*доспехи / даспехи*). The armour is quite heavy. #### Situation 3

**Student A** is an artisan at the festival crafts fair. You have a lot of linen, wooden, glass, ceramic and iron souvenirs on the stall. All of them are related to the festival, e.g. a key ring in the shape of a sword or a shield, a linen embroidered shirt with the name of the festival, a medieval clay pot, etc. Tell the tourist about them and persuade him / her to buy something as a keepsake from the festival. Ask the tourist if he / she likes the festival and its activities.

**Student B** is a tourist. You are at the festival crafts fair. You come up to a stall with linen, wooden, glass, ceramic and iron souvenirs. Admire the souvenirs while talking to the artisan. Ask the artisan about them and buy something as a keepsake from the festival. Say how you are going to use this thing. Express your feelings about the festival.

#### Situation 4

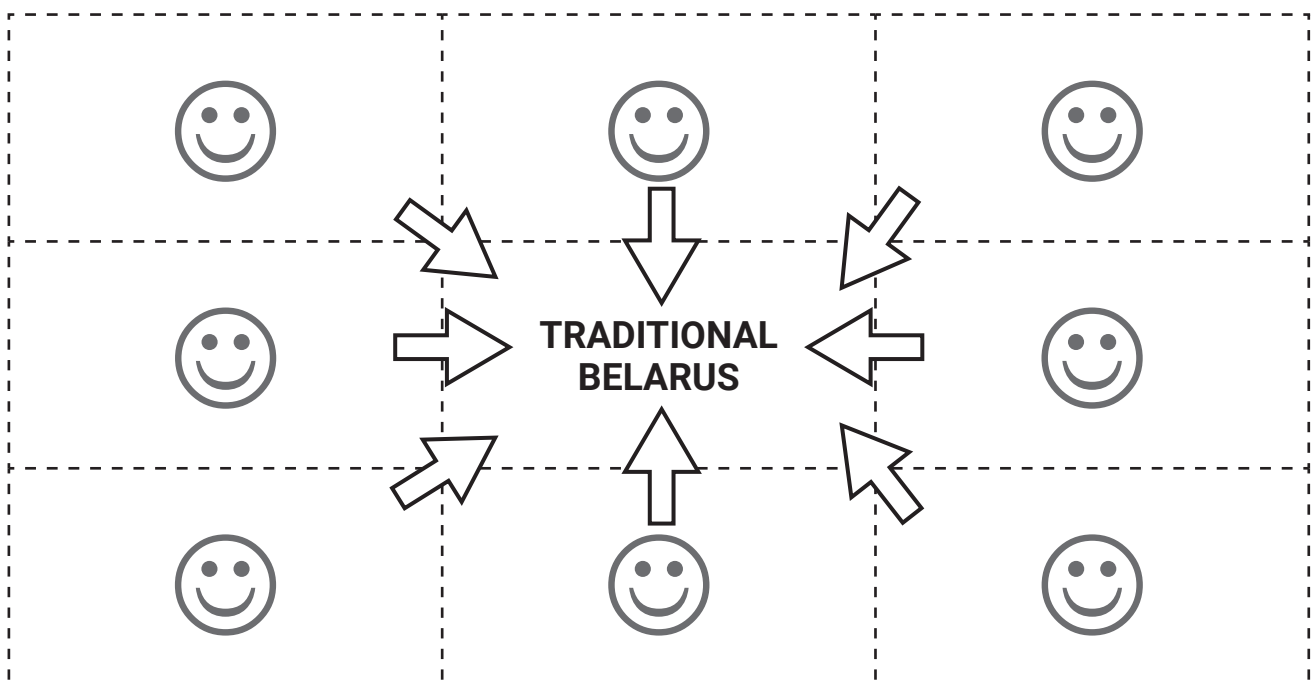

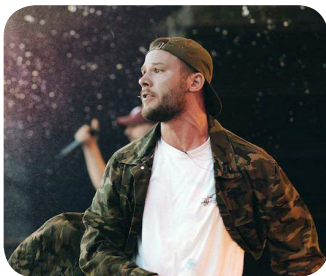
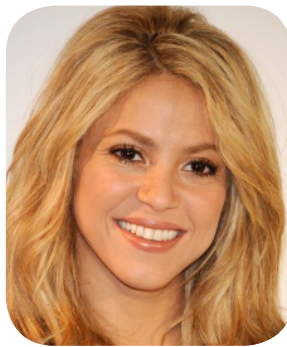
